

As snug as a Victorian bug

CAPE MAY - A one-bedroom condo might seem small for a family, but for a couple looking for a place of their own in the heart of Cape May, condo unit 1-C at 101 S. Lafayette St. could be a snug little Victorian getaway.

Just one block to the beach, and two blocks to the Washington Street Mall, this unit is located in the Belvedere Condominium at the corner of S. Lafayette St. and Windsor Avenue.

This first floor unit is one bedroom/one bath and has the convenience of direct access from the owner's assigned parking space.

"There is also a front door space, but you can directly enter the unit from a back door," said Jim Cheney of Jersey Cape Realty.

Cheney said this condo is a smaller unit, but it is priced accordingly at \$279,000. He said the proximity to the beach and downtown shopping, entertainment and dining make this a valuable and attractive property. And the condominium is located on a part of Lafayette Street a lot of people never even see.

"Most people blank out on it," Cheney said, "but people really like that neighborhood. The people who own there love that part of town. You can't pry them loose to look at another end of town."

"If I was not living in Cape May, and coming back for vacation, this is the part of town I would want to live in," he said.

Just a block's walk to the beach near the Lifeguard Headquarters at Grant Street, this location is also a short walk to the mall.

"There is something about that," Cheney said. "If you are here on a short vacation you would want to be on that end of town, just west of the mall. It's convenient to all the downtown bars and restaurants."

That location makes it an attractive property to renters, which makes it at-
