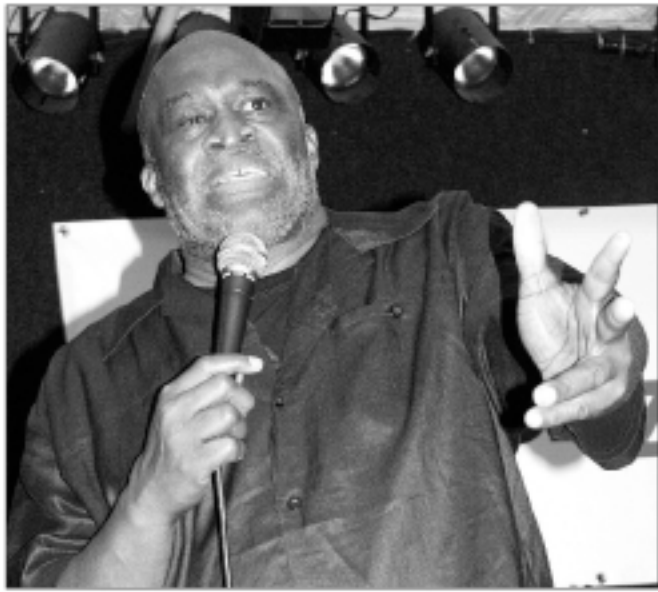




Cape May Jazz Festival Sunday afternoon jams one of the highlights of the weekend
