Donna Juliani was Correia's neighbor whom he affectionately referred to as "D." Proudly stating she was one of "Gus' Gals", Juliani was reflective when asked to come up with a quote to describe Correia. "What a man," she said. "He cheered everybody up that he knew. He was the greatest guy. He had so many guitars. He kept throwing guitars in my hands so we could jam at the point. He was a good musician with a good heart." Correia's good heart could also be found in his love for helping those less fortunate than him. It also is found in a love of dogs. A few years ago, Correia was the driving force behind the "Dog Parade" held on the Promenade, which brought out dogs of every breed vying for the chance to wins awards rang-

ing from "the prettiest" to "the friendliest" to "best dressed" and "ugliest in show." Each award reflected Correia's unique outlook on life. Vickie Tryon, owner of her own wedding boutique, also reflected on Correia having his own outlook. "Gus always had an opinion," she said, "but he was an artist first. So, his opinion was always very artistic and original. And that's why you loved him, whether you agreed with his opinion or not." As the night went on, no one could avoid noticing Jeffrey Hebron. Not only because Hebron stands nearly seven feet tall, but because he worked with Correia for over 10 years when Correia's leather shop was located at Cold Spring Village. "We sort of made ourselves famous there," Hebron recalled. "We were happy talking with the kids. Gus used to make them laugh. Gus had
