Cape May-Lewes Ferry adds car rentals

NORTH CAPE MAY — The Cape May-Lewes Ferry has partnered with Avis Budget Group to operate car rental locations at the Cape May and Lewes, Del., ferry terminals.

Avis and Budget rental locations will serve ferry customers and the neighboring communities. The service began Aug. 30.

The rental car service counter inside the Cape May

terminal is to the left in the main terminal entrance. In Lewes, it's adjacent to the terminal sliding doors from the parking lot.

In addition to the counter space inside, Avis Budget has 10 parking spaces adjacent to each terminal building reserved for vehicles ready for customer rental and 25 parking spaces in the general parking area for additional inventory. Signs at

these spots indicate they are for Avis vehicles only.

The Cape May Terminal location is open seasonally, from May 1 through Sept. 30. Hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. On the weekend, the Cape May location will open 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Masks must be properly fitted, made of cloth, breathable and freely diffuse carbon dioxide. He said parents are to provide multiple masks for students in case the mask needs to be changed during the school day. The nurse's office will have disposable masks available.

Students, staff and visitors will not be allowed in the building without a mask regardless of vaccination status. Students will be given a mask to wear and if they refuse to wear it, they will be sent home as mandated in state guidelines.

For a vaccinated person who has been exposed by a person who has tested positive or symptomatic, it

is recommend they be tested on days three through five. Those who experience close contact, especially teachers, can remain at school with masks until symptomatic or testing positive.

As of the meeting date, Cape May was a high-risk area because of its population and the number of positive cases, Palombo said.

During a time of low or moderate cases in the county, for a person experiencing a close contact with a person who tested positive but is able to isolate, if the student has no symptoms, they may return to school on day eight or day 10 with a negative test taken on days five through seven, after the date of exposure. If they choose not to get tested, they may not return until day 11, Palombo said.

For someone who was in close contact with a person who tested positive but is not able to isolate away from the person, they may return without symptoms on days 18 to 20 with a negative PCR test on days 15 to 17. Rapid tests will not be accepted. For someone who will not receive a test, they must remain out of school for 21 days.

The school's website, cmc-boe.org, has a complete list of scenarios and time that must be spent out of school when a student is exposed to someone with COVID.

"If your kid has symptoms and you want your kid back in school, my fastest suggestion is get them tested right away," Palombo said.

Students who need to quarantine will have access to all materials through packets and/or digital technology, he said. They will not be marked absent if materials are completed and the student is able to meet with their teacher.

The nurse's office is receiving a washer and dryer for contaminated materials, according to Palombo.

"We would prefer you to drive your child to school, so they are not sitting on the bus," he said.

If a student who rides the bus tests positive, it would be difficult to determine who must quarantine. Palombo said he did not want to quarantine everyone riding a bus.

School doors will not open until 8:30 a.m. and the school will not provide before-school or after-school care.

Swimming in the school's pool will resume for grades three through six on Sept. 13. The school has five staff members trained as lifeguards, Palombo said.
